• Tell us about your top U.S. Supreme Court or federal appeals court victory over the past year and how you and your team achieved the win. For decades, virtually all the lower courts had held that a party seeking to challenge the constitutionality of a federal agency couldn't do

so until after it had submitted to the full gamut of unconstitutional agency proceedings. In Axon, the U.S. Supreme Court unanimously reversed that near-consensus. The Supreme Court's decision not only paves the way for people to get critical constitutional questions into the courts much more quickly, but also makes it harder for

agencies to insulate themselves from constitutional challenges by pressuring parties into administrative settlements.
